University of California Press HighWire Platform Migration FAQ

Subscription-related questions:

1. What does this mean for my current University of California Press subscriptions on JSTOR? Who do I renew with for the 2015 subscription year?
 - a. Current University of California Press subscriptions for 2014 are unaffected. For 2015 subscription year **renewals**, please continue to direct subscription inquiries to JSTOR or to your subscription agent. JSTOR will continue to provide access to UC Press titles on the JSTOR platform through 2015.
2. What do I do if I want to order new subscriptions from University of California Press? What if I want to order a package that includes UC Press titles in addition to other titles in the Current Scholarship Program?
 - a. For any **new subscriptions** for the 2015 subscription year, please contact orders@ucpress.edu. Please note that UC Press titles are not included in Current Scholarship Program packages for the 2015 subscription year. Libraries that had previously subscribed to Current Scholarship Program packages that included UC Press titles will be able to renew access however.
3. Will there be redundancy between the 2 platforms? How much time will I have to transition?
 - a. There will be an overlap of UC Press content between the JSTOR and HighWire platforms beginning in mid-2015, with concurrent hosting through the end of 2015. More details will be available later this year.
4. Will JSTOR be sharing the details of my subscription with UC Press' new platform provider?
 - a. Yes, UC Press will work with JSTOR to ensure seamless access to subscriptions.
5. Will this transition adhere to the Transfer Code of Practice?
 - a. Yes.
6. Will I need to sign a new license agreement?
 - a. As content is moving to a new platform, the agreement that covers UC Press journals on the JSTOR platform will terminate and a new license agreement will need to be signed. 7. Will I continue to have access to the same set of subscription years on the new platform?
 - a. Yes, you will continue to have access to those years that you have purchased previously.
8. Will perpetual access/PCA still be available?

- a. Yes, post-cancellation access will be available. The new draft license will specify these terms. The draft license will be available for review in early 2015.
- 9. What if I'm accessing content on JSTOR as part of a PCA claim?
 - a. More information will be available later this year.
- 10. What if I have a full run subscription to a UC Press title?
 - a. More information will be available later this year.
- 11. What do I do if I have a back issue claim for a 2014 P+E subscription after UC Press is no longer on the JSTOR platform?
 - i. You may claim an issue 30 days after the date of publication. This is the date the journal is mailed from the printer.
 - ii. Customers in US/Canada should claim within 90 days of the mail date.
 - iii. All other customers should claim within 180 days.
 - iv. After these dates the regular single-issue rate will be charged.
- 12. What if I have a rolling start subscription that extends into CY 2016?
 - a. More information will be available later this year.
- 13. How does this affect UC Press content within JSTOR's archival collections?
 - a. UC Press will continue its participation in JSTOR archival collections.
